Quality Child Care

Choosing a nursery is an important decision for you and your family, therefore we hope the following information will answer any questions you may have about the Unit's aims, standards of child care and education to enable you to have complete confidence that you are making the right choice.

Our School has catered for nursery children since 1982.

We provide quality child care and education for children aged 12 weeks to 5 years in a relaxed, caring environment by experienced nursery staff.

Blagur Haf is situated on the site of Caergeiliog Foundation School, Caergeiliog, Anglesey some 3 minutes off Junction 4 of the A55 making us very accessible to our clients.

Aims and Objectives:

Blagur Haf aims to:

- provide a safe, secure, welcoming and happy environment for children from the ages of 12 weeks to 5 years.
- provide quality experiences for children aged 0 to 3 years.
- follow the **Foundation Phase Framework** for children aged 3 to 5 years in order to provide quality activities and experiences to promote each child's development and learning in all 8 areas of the curriculum.
- Enable each child to become a confident individual, an effective contributor, a successful learner and a responsible citizen.

The wellbeing of children and young people is at the heart of our provision and thus we aim to:

- treat every child as an individual and meet additional needs regardless of gender, race, nationality and culture without discriminating.
- encourage equal opportunities for all children and adults involved with the nursery.
- recognise the value of parents input and encourage them to share in their children's learning.
- promote positive behaviour by praising, encouraging and being attentive to the needs of the children.
- continually assess the guidance available from all sources, particularly government departments and have best practice in all areas.
- value all staff highly and ensure that every opportunity is given to each staff member to develop their personal skills and to broaden their knowledge and skills in caring for and educating your children.

Partnership with Parents:

You, as parents are the prime educators of your children in their earliest years. We therefore welcome and encourage parents' involvement in the nursery.

We have an 'open door' policy in place and members of staff are always available to listen to your comments and suggestions.

Effective communication between parents and nursery staff is important to provide the best possible care for your children. We would appreciate if you could inform crèche/nursery staff of any circumstances, either temporary or permanent which may affect your child's emotional or physical wellbeing to ensure your child receives additional support if necessary. A member of staff will be available to speak to you on a daily basis to discuss your child's progress and answer any questions you may have. You will be kept informed of nursery events and activities through our notice board in the entrance hall, newsletters and via our website. In your child's room, you will also find notice boards giving information on the day's activities.

Confidentiality:

All information regarding your child/family will be kept in the strictest confidence in accordance with the <u>Data Protection Act</u>.

Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW)

Blagur Haf is registered with the CIW who are the registration and inspection body for all pre-school centres in Wales. The nursery is inspected regularly by the Care Inspectorate to ensure the high standards of childcare and education are being met.

Stages in the Unit's Provision:

Pre-Birth to Three:

The four key features of Pre-Birth to Three provision are closely linked:

- Rights of the Child
- Relationships
- Responsive Care
- Respect

Our crèche/nursery staff work to provide the quality experiences children under 3 years need: from

- feeding,
- cuddles and nappy changing to
- sensory experiences,
- outdoor play and music.

Baby Room and First Steps $(0 - 21\2 Years)$

The Baby Room and First Steps at **Blagur Haf** provides warmth, fun and security for children. The rooms allow staff to provide the appropriate activities for your child's age group and developmental stage.

It is important for children of this age to receive continuity of care between nursery and home therefore the nursery staff will ensure your child's familiar routine is maintained.

The staff encourages the babies to freely explore and enjoy their play activities in a safe, relaxed environment allowing them to develop their confidence, independence and learning.

A variety of resources, activities and experiences on offer for children under 1 years include:

- Music, songs, rhymes, to copy actions and musical instruments to explore different concepts such as loud and soft, to get different facial expressions from the different sounds of music.
- 'Peek-a-boo' and other simple interactive games to encourage social interaction.
- Treasure Baskets (baskets containing sensory items with (First Steps) different textures, sounds and smells).
- Extensive selection of books, stories and rhymes which helps to develop communication and language.
- Sand play, water play, paint, play dough help develop creativity and is a sensory experience for young children.
- Outside fun Taking the children outside. Let them feel different surfaces, let them sit and crawl on the grass, feel stones and leaves with supervision – some objects can look like a tasty treat.

21\2 Years - 31\2 Years

In our 21\2 Years - 31\2 Years room is used by our nursery staff to provide the quality experiences your child needs at this stage as they begin to assert their independence and individuality.

- Music, songs, rhymes, musical instruments, action songs ('ring-a-rosies', 'this little piggy') etc. to develop language skills, physical development and expression through music.
- Your child will be encouraged to access resources and exercise freedom of choice about the activities they wish to participate in.
- Stimulating conversation, interactive play and learning to socialise, share and make friends is all part of the day.
- Walks and outdoor play for health, fitness, physical development and learning about 'the world around us'.
- Heuristic Play (play using everyday objects such as wooden spoons and pans which encourages curiosity and exploration and offers opportunities to categorise and compare)
- The nursery staff will support your child through toilet training and developing independence at meal times in a secure, loving environment.
- Activities planned in accordance with The Foundation Phase Framework.

31\2 - 41\2 Years Activities

As well as many of the activities already mentioned in Baby Room and First Steps your child will also be able to participate in:

• Extensive selection of books, stories, poems and rhymes to encourage communication and language.

- Multi-cultural musical instruments, singing, action songs, musical games, music and movement.
- Daily opportunities for outdoor play for health, fitness and physical development.
- Introduction to computer skills through the supervised use of interactive educational programmes. The nursery also has a wide range of interactive toys and resources to further your child's I.T knowledge.
- Sand play, water play to introduce early science concepts such as pouring, measuring, wet, dry, full, empty.
- Extensive opportunities for encouraging expressive development through painting, gluing and drawing using a variety of art materials.
- Play dough and clay are sensory experiences which encourage small motor skills in hands and fingers.
- Activities planned in accordance with The Foundation Phase Framework.
- Role play through dressing up, using puppets and 'let's pretend' in the home corner. Children use role play to make sense of the world around them through acting out familiar experiences.
- Cooking and baking helps develop science knowledge such as measuring and weighing. Healthy eating habits are also encouraged.
- Planting and growing activities both in the garden and indoors to encourage the children to care for living things and gain knowledge of nature and the world around them.
- An extensive range of construction toys such as bricks and lego to encourage small motor skills in the fingers and hands.

Your Child's Progress (Pre-Birth to Three)

The staff members at **Blagur Haf** monitor and record each child's progress. For children aged 0 to 3 years the following areas of development are observed by our staff:

- Physical Development the most important area of physical development for very young children is to have their physical needs met: warmth, nutrition and health care. Children from birth to three will go through many stages of large physical development including: learning to roll over, sit up, crawl, walk, run and jump. Fine motor skills are also very important beginning with grasping rattles through to holding a pencil or crayon.
- Social Development from birth children enjoy social interaction through cuddles, eye contact and facial expressions. Social development also involves your child becoming more independent in feeding, dressing, toileting and expressing their thoughts and feelings.
- Cognitive Development very young children use all 5 senses to make discoveries about the world around them. Repetitive learning experiences are very important for children under 3 years old as their memory is still developing. Cognitive development includes: language development, recognition of colours, simple problem solving, basic counting skills and matching and sorting skills.

All children are treated as individuals. We recognise that each child will develop at his or her own pace therefore developmental stages are used as guidance only.



The Curriculum – The Foundation Phase Framework

Pre-school Room (3 to 5 Years)

In the Pre-school Room your child will have the opportunity to experience a range of activities which meet all eight areas of the curriculum. Your child will be introduced to early reading, writing, maths and science skills. These activities are delivered in a fun, relaxed manner allowing all children to learn naturally through play. Each child is encouraged to learn at their own pace within their own capabilities.

Pre-school Room Activities

The children in the Pre-school Room can participate in all the activities mentioned previously for the under 3's although these activities are more structured in the Pre-school Room and offered at a level suited to their age.

In the Pre-school Room your child will also have the opportunity to experience:

- Interest Tables e.g. a harvest table with wheat, flour, bread or a beach table with shells, sand, pebbles, seaweed. The children are encouraged to freely experiment and explore the items on the table.
- Writing Table to introduce your child to mark making and 'writing' using a variety
 of pens and pencils. Your child will be encouraged to use the writing table that
 develops pencil control for more formal writing later.
- Science Experiments e.g. simply showing the children that flowers 'drink' water by placing a white flower in a vase of coloured water – the flower will become the colour of the water.
- Computer Skills your child will have access to a computer, printer and digital camera in the Pre-school Room. Interactive, educational software helps your child learn basic mouse skills such as point, click, point and drag, scrolling etc. Your child will be able to take their own photographs and print them out to include in their portfolio if they wish. There are also many other interactive games and resources available for your child to use.

The Curriculum:

The Curriculum aims to ensure pre-school children's developmental needs are met. The emphasis is on learning through quality play experiences in a relaxed atmosphere. There are eight areas of the curriculum:

- Health and Wellbeing
- Language and Literacy
- Mathmatics and Numeracy
- Expressive Arts
- Religious and Moral Education
- Science
- Social Studies
- Technology

It also aims to focus playroom practice upon the child and around the four capacities of education:

- successful learners
- confident individuals
- responsible citizens
- effective contributor

FACILITIES

Nursery 1: Located in the building opposite the Main School Building.

15 Place unit- (under 2 years and 6 months) 1:3 ratio

- A new and purpose built building including:
- A bright and airy playroom with a double French window looking out onto the outdoor area/ field area
- A messy room
- A separate quiet/sleep room
- A bathroom with baby changing facilities
- A secure private room for handover of children and discussions with parents
- A kitchen
- A large range of suitable resources and stimulating activities suitable for the age group
- Separated play area into two areas- babies and toddlers
- Staff trained in Food Hygiene Level 2.
- Staff trained in Safeguarding and Paediatric First Aid.
- CCTV
- Staff panic buttons
- Locked key fob doors for extra security.
- All staff fully aware of policies and Risk Assessments
- An outdoor area for outdoor play
- Located on a quiet country lane suitable for walks in prams

Nursery 2: Located on Main School Site

16 place unit- (2years and 6 months-3 years and 6 months) 1:4 ratio

- A purpose made Lillyput Building consisting of three rooms
- A large, bright and welcoming playroom
- Toilets, shower, sinks and first aid facilities
- A quiet area with cushions and sleeping mats
- An allocated messy area
- Tables and chairs for table top activities
- Enhanced learning areas including sand, water, role play, construction and malleable etc.
- Activities planned from The Foundation Phase Framework
- A large range of suitable resources and stimulating activities
- ICT equipment including an Interactive whiteboard, laptops and IPad.
- Purpose built secure, fenced outdoor learning area including a track, sandpit and climbing equipment

- Key workers allocated to ensure a smooth transition from one room to another
- Friendly and approachable staff
- High levels of communication between parents and staff
- Children Health and wellbeing affectively promoted.
- Staff trained in Food Hygiene Level 2.
- Staff trained in Safeguarding and Paediatric First Aid.
- All staff fully aware of policies and Risk Assessments
- Air conditioning unit

Nursery 3: Located on Main School Site

26 place unit- (3 and 6 months - 4 years old) 1:8 ratio

- Two large bright playrooms
- A kitchen
- Toilets, shower, sinks and first aid facilities
- An allocated messy area
- Key workers
- A large range of suitable resources and stimulating activities
- Purpose built secure, fenced outdoor learning area including a track, sandpit and climbing equipment
- Toilets, shower, sinks and first aid facilities
- Children Health and wellbeing are affectively promoted.
- Staff trained in Food Hygiene Level 2.
- Staff trained in Safeguarding and Paediatric First Aid.
- ICT equipment including an Interactive whiteboard, laptops and iPads.
- All staff are fully aware of policies and Risk Assessments
- Activities planned using "The Foundation Phase Framework"
- Children assessed regularly on their development and progress fed back to parents.
- Air conditioning unit

OUTDOOR AREA

We have two secure, fenced outdoor play areas, safely located outside the buildings (solely for the use of Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog). There is a rubber surface for the use of bikes, trikes and prams and a grass area with planters as well as climbing equipment.

Parents are welcomed to come in to discuss their child's needs and to become familiar with the facilities offered prior to starting our nursery provision. They are also introduced to their child's key worker.

Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog intends to offer a child centred environment meeting the social physical, intellectual, creative and emotional needs of each individual child.

ACTIVITIES

Educational tasks and activities are planned weekly which also offer opportunities for free play. Children are encouraged to participate in the planning of activities and ideas for equipment. Activities are carried out indoor and in the outdoor area.

Pupils will be allowed into Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog at 7.30 a.m

On arrival at Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog pupils will be welcomed and helped with their coats and bags. After breakfast, each session will start with registration and 'on the mat' activities.

There is then a programme of structured activities available for the children to participate in. However, free-play opportunities also exist and children are encouraged to take part in a wide range of experiences. There is emphasis on individual choice. A quiet area is also made available.

ROUTINES

There is a specific routine for each age group. In the baby unit, we will work with the parents to ensure that we are able to work in harmony with the routine that the child has at home, in order to ensure a smooth transition between nursery and the home environment. Each child will have a key worker who will ensure that the child's needs are met fully and that every child is content.

In the Playgroup and Nursery children will take part in a range of activities, and will have an opportunity to learn and discover new things. We follow the Foundation Phase Framework and activities are planned on a weekly basis. The Digital Competency Framework is also incorporated into the planning. We also plan for children to take part in day to day activities such as painting, play dough, sand and water play. In the Playgroup and Nursery, we follow a theme every term which is displayed in the foyer.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Security:

A security entry system is placed at the entrance to ensure access by authorised persons only. We require notification of who is authorised to collect your child from nursery. Under no circumstances will a child be allowed to leave the premises unless with a previously identified, authorised person.

Languages Used

The main language of Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog is English and Welsh. Bilingual signs are used where appropriate.

Registration and Collection

Children attending Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog must have completed registration form submitted to the Responsible Person. This form is vitally important as it contains specific information about your child such as allergies, special needs, emergency contacts etc.

You can obtain a Registration Form from the Registered Person / Responsible Person. You should however keep a copy for yourself so that you can check it periodically for accuracy.

Any changes in your child's circumstances need to be communicated to the Responsible Person as early as possible.

To book your child into Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog you need to inform the School as soon as possible. Payment is required at the end of each session or each week.

In the event that you personally are unable to collect the child we ask for a password, this to be quoted by the person nominated to collect the child. Please be aware that we cannot release your child unless we have prior notice of this event and the person collecting your child knows the password. (This can be anything that only you, the staff and the person collecting the child will know).

Admission Policy

Meithrinfa Blagur Haf is open to any child registered at Ysgol Caergeiliog. No child shall receive less favourable treatment on the grounds of race, colour, ethnic or national origin, religious beliefs, disability or the ability to pay.

In order to ensure fairness in the allocation of places, the following criteria will be taken into consideration:

First priority will be given to children of working parents/single working parents, parents who are studying or training to re-enter the workforce. Then places will be given to children who are booking to everyday of the week.

If places are limited siblings of children already at the school will have priority over others. While available places exist, these will be allocated on a first come first offer basis. If Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog is oversubscribed a waiting list will be kept and administered by the person in charge.

Placement fees must be paid at the end of each session or at the end of each week. This is not refundable except in exceptional circumstances, of which will be determined by the Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog Committee.

The Committee reserves the right to refuse admission to any child whose behaviour is, in our opinion, not in the best interest of the other children's health and safety. (This course of action would only be implemented once our agreed procedures for tackling behaviour problems have been exhausted).

For Our Full Admissions Policy Please See The Parent Handbook / Operational File. We are a fully bilingual service and offer activities through the medium of both Welsh and English.

Parents are asked to complete a contract beforehand. Please ask for a 'Meithrinfa Blagur Haf Caergeiliog Contract' and Admission Form.

Contact Information

On registering your child with the nursery you will be asked for contact information. We are required to have details about you and your child; so that we are able to contact you in an emergency and that we have details of your child's medical history. An additional name and number must be provided in the event that we cannot contact the parents / carers should the need arise. Please make sure that you contact us with any changes to telephone numbers or addresses. We also ask that you state your child's needs, preferences and dietary requirements.

Complaints Procedure

Our Parent/Carers Handbook (Operational File) sets out the Meithrinfa Blagur Haf's policies and we recommend that all users read this.

Introductory Sessions

Before your child begins full days or sessions at **Blagur Haf** we would recommend that you and your child visit on several occasions for short introductory sessions. You are encouraged to stay with your child until he or she settles after which time we would suggest that you leave for short periods until both you and your child are relaxed and comfortable in the nursery setting. No charge is made for the introductory sessions.

"Children learn very quickly that nursery is a fun, friendly place to be therefore the settling-in period is rarely as difficult as you might imagine."

Daily Report Sheets

When your child is in the Baby Room, you will receive a daily report sheet detailing your child's eating and sleeping patterns, fluid intake, toileting progress and information about the activities your child has participated in that day. The nursery staff will discuss your child's day with you, however the daily report sheets are a useful reference to take home.

Sleep Times

We have a separate sleep room where your child can use a cot, bouncy chair or a swing for their sleep times. Each child has their own bed linen and are calmly settled for their sleep by the nursery staff.

Progress Reports/Learning Journal

Each child at **Blagur Haf**, (at Pre-Birth to Three stage and Curriculum for Excellence stage), have their own learning journal which staff complete regularly to record your child's milestones and achievements. Parents will be able to view photographs of their child at play, which gives parents a better understanding of what their child participates in, and the experiences they enjoy at the nursery.

You will receive two progress reports per year detailing your child's progress and development and you are welcome to view your child's portfolio at any time.

Activity Planning

The nursery staff plan activities to meet the children's individual learning and will link to the Foundation Phase Framework. These plans are flexible and respond to your child's individual interests, needs and developmental stage. There will be a broad, balanced range of activities.

Planning for children under 3 years is less structured and responsive following the Pre-Birth to Three Guidance which will meet each child's needs and abilities.

Illness

For the health and wellbeing of all children attending **Blagur Haf** your child should not attend the crèche/ nursery if he/she is suffering from an infectious illness. If your child suffers from a non-infectious illness or an allergy we will endeavour to accommodate any special requirements they may have.

Dealing with an Emergency

In the event of illness, accident or emergency we will act on the parents behalf and take such action as we consider appropriate. This may include taking your child from the nursery to seek medical attention. Every effort will be made to contact parents in all cases of emergencies. Our policy regarding Emergencies can be found in our 'Policies' file.

Medication

Parental permission is required for all medication to be administered at **Blagur Haf**.

Promoting Positive Behaviour

Positive behaviour is promoted at **Blagur Haf** through praise and encouragement from the nursery staff. Children will receive little attention for negative behaviour, therefore they quickly realise that the positive behaviour will be rewarded.

Our staff will keep you fully informed if your child requires support in this area at any time. If a pattern of behaviour causing more concern develops, we will discuss this with you and agree steps to move forward in the best interests of your child and the crèche/nursery.

Additional Needs

If your child requires extra support for any reason, either on a temporary or permanent basis, we will make every effort to provide this support. The crèche/nursery staff are experienced at working closely with parents and other professionals such as Health Visitors, Speech and Language Therapists and Paediatricians to help your child reach his or her full potential.

All pupils are treated as individuals and we endeavour to meet their specific special needs. Parents are obliged to complete the Special Needs section of the contract before the pupil's starting date.

If extra support is needed then a meeting will be held with the schools SENCO (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator) and parents to ensure the correct support is given.

What do I Bring?

Depending on your child's age and stage of development you will need to provide:

- formula or breast milk,
- nappies,
- soft indoor shoes,
- suitable outdoor clothing and a change of clothes.

If your child has a comfort toy, blanket or a dummy you should also bring these to nursery.

Clothing and Personal Property

Your child will be involved in messy activities at the crèche/nursery and although the staff will encourage them to wear aprons whenever possible, we would advise that your child does not wear 'good / expensive' clothes to the crèche/nursery as accidents can happen!

It is helpful if you mark all your child's belongings with his or her name as it can be difficult for the crèche/nursery staff to locate un-named items.

We would also recommend that children do not bring toys from home as they can become upset if items become mislaid or broken. Favourite books and comfort toys are of course always welcome.

Parents Evenings

Parent Evenings are held once a year for all children. Although the nursery staff are available on a daily basis, this gives parents/guardians the opportunity to discuss their child's progress and transition to primary education in a relaxed atmosphere on an individual basis.

Nativity Play

Each Christmas the children will be encouraged to perform a nativity play for their families. Christmas is always an exciting time for children and they enjoy the opportunity to tell the Christmas story through their own interpretation.

Policies

Blagur Haf has an extensive number of policies and procedures in place including: (Health and Safety, Equal Opportunities, Child Protection, Partnership with Parents, Illness Procedure, Prevention of Infection, Additional Needs Policy and many more). All of our policies and procedures can be viewed below. They are also displayed in the nursery hallway for your information or you can request copies from the Nursery Manager.

Emergency Places

Should you require extra days/sessions for your child at short notice, perhaps due to illness, bereavement or work commitments, we will make every effort to accommodate your request. These emergency sessions are charged at the normal nursery rate.

Forms will be issued for the setting up of Standing Orders for monthly payments. Payments are to be made on the 1st of each month – in advance.

We would always recommend that you view the Unit before making your final decision to place your child with us. Following your visit to **Blagur Haf** the process of enrolment is as follows: We will check our availability to ensure the days or sessions you require are available. If your required sessions are available we will issue you with the Unit's Registration Forms.

If your required days or sessions are unavailable you can elect to place your child on our Waiting List. Our Waiting List operates on a 'first come, first served' basis however priority is given to children who currently have siblings attending **Caergeiliog Foundation School**.
